CONCERNING THE HOLY SACRIFICE OF THE MASS - - (Three Parts) - PART I

The Sacrifice of the Mass actually starts with the opening prayers of the Canon. The uncovering of the Chalice by the celebrant indicates that preparations for the Offertory are about to begin. From the very start of the Canon there are two dominant themes in the Action of the Mass: (1) GIVING TO GOD and (2) RECEIVING FROM GOD. The gifts that we give are ourselves and the crucified Christ; the gifts we receive are Christ's Body and Blood. By giving bread which is the very marrow of the earth, and by giving wine, which is its very blood, we are giving the two substances which have most traditionally nourished us, and thereby we are equivalently giving ourselves.

NOTE WELL: (St. Pius V Chapel) - - Because of absolute necessity, the time for mass at St. Pius V Chapel must be changed. Henceforth, the time for mass shall be 9:30 A.M. (not 10:00 A.M.)

Friday, August 15th. is the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed 2. Virgin, and is a Holy Day of Obligation. Masses (only) at St. Francis

Chapel will be at 6:00 A.M. and 5:30 P.M.

The Charitable prayers of all are asked for the Soul of Father Jonathan 3. Franklin, O.S.B. Father Jonathan died on Friday, August 1, 1986.

Confessions are heard before each Mass. 4.

During these days, the THIRD PRAYER of the Mass is for rain. 5.
