CONCERNING THE HOLY SACRIFICE OF THE MASS - - (Three Parts) - - Part II

The ancient and unchanging sequence of the Canon Prayers contains the heart of the Mass, namely, the Consecration. Through the words and the Action of the Canon, the celebrant accomplishes the great work of the Mass: the bringing of Christ Himself down on our altars that we may then offer Him to God - - - in the Mass we offer God to God! Our gifts of bread and wine, representing ourselves, are transformed - - (transubstantiated)- - - into the Body and Blood of Christ. Then the celebrant offers Christ and ourselves, in union with Christ, to God.

1. The confessing of our sins to a priest is called the Sacrament of Penance. A sacrament is an outward sign instituted by Christ to give grace. One should receive the Sacrament of Penance often because of the sacramental Grace received in the reception of the sacrament. Therefore, one should not use the sacrament of Penance only at times of need.
2. Confessions are heard before each Mass.
3. Friday, August 22, 1986 is the Feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Therefore, everyone is encouraged to re-evaluate his and her interest in the devotion to the Most Holy Rosary.
4. During these days, the THIRD PRAYER of the Mass is for rain.
5. We can know by our natural reason that there is a God, for natural reason tells us that the world we see about us could have been made only by a self-existing Being, all-wise and almighty. If we study the beauties of the world, we can see God's power and intelligence and love and mercy.
6. Besides knowing God by our natural reason, we can also know Him from supernatural revelation, that is, from the truths found in Sacred Scripture and in Holy Tradition, which God Himself has revealed to us. Supernatural means "above the natural." These truths are above our natural power to think out for ourselves. God had to tell us or we would not know them.
