In recent months a great deal has been said about the growing discontent of Catholic People with the Vatican and the Roman Magisterium. The discontent seems to be over the various decision pronouncements the Vatican has made on such issues as sexuality, birth control, abortion, the seriousness of the marriage vows and the vows of Religion, ordination of women, the marriage of the clergy, etc. Matters that are NOT open to anyone's interpretation or application since they are matters clearly set down by God's own COMMAND and the ancient and venerable teaching of the Apostolic Church of Jesus Christ. In former times the Catholic priesthood, being faithful to its promise of loyalty to the Holy Apostolic Church, supported, explained and defended all such high church teachings. This is no longer true! Today, the most vocal critics of the Church's Magisterium are its own priests and bishops and nuns! These are the ones who are spreading the SEEDS OF DISCONTENT and the Catholic people are merely giving voice to the words that have been placed in their mouths by their clergy.

1. The Last Sunday after Pentecost is the conclusion of the Liturgical Year of the Church. The First Sunday of Advent is the beginning of the new Liturgical Year, and everything begins with the PROMISE of the coming of a Messiah.
2. The Season of Advent (somewhat like the Season of Lent) is a time for additional prayers and good works. Voluntary fasting and abstaining are praiseworthy. Remember the Friday abstinence.
3. In your charity please pray for Father Paschal Ferlisi, O.S.B. who is very sick.
4. Wherever possible, the Home Advent wreath ceremony is highly recommended. Attached is a suggested ceremony. The suggested readings from Scripture are strongly recommended.
5. Pray the Holy Rosary - - - every chance you get.
6. Even though the celebration of Thanksgiving has strong secular overtones, the offering of sincere thanks to God for all past favors is in keeping with church tradition. Do not forget the religious atmosphere of Thanksgiving Day.
