In today's Church, broad circles in theology seem to have forgotten that the individual who pursues theology is not the individual scholor or professor, but the Catholic Community as a whole, the entire Church. Every theologian now seems to want to be 'creative'. But his PROPER work is to study and to deepen the COMMON DEPOSIT OF FAITH. It is the work of the theologian to bring about a better understanding of the Deposit of Faith. IT IS NOT HIS WORK TO CREATE NEW DEPOSITS OF FAITH. In recent years theologians have dedicated themselves to bring Faith and the Signs of the Times into agreement with each other in order to find "better meaningful ways" to extend the boundaries of Catholicism. But many have had to come to the sad realization that these efforts have often contributed more to the aggravation than to the resolution of the present crisis in the Catholic Church. In order to accomodate themselves to the changing times, theologians have taken the view that the traditional definitions of DOGMATIC AND MORAL THEOLOGY are so many intolerable straitjackets: assaults on the freedoms of the individual scholar and of the "people of God".
