We are seldom conscious of the truth that during the reception of HOLY COMMUNION, we truly receive God the Father and God the Holy Ghost as we receive God the Son. The reason is that all external acts of the Divinity are performed by the Trinity as from a single source. St. Thomas says that, "Everything that God has done outside the Godhead is the work of ALL THREE Persons, a work done by virtue of the divine nature which is COMMON to Them all." Surely Holy Communion is one of these works. Our Blessed Lord said that if anyone loved Him, His Father would love him, and "We shall come and take up our 'abode' with him." Where the Father and the Son are present, there also is the Holy Ghost. We believe that in Holy Communion we receive the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ. This is because the Father and Holy Ghost do not have the body and soul which is hypostatically united to the Divine Second Person ONLY. ONLY the Son is True God and True Man. He is the ONE Divine Nature TOGETHER with the Father and the Holy Ghost. So, when we receive God the Son, we receive ALSO the other two Persons of the Holy Trinity. This is a Mystery - of course!!! In our own words we simply say that in Holy Communion we receive Christ. This is true, but Christ is God. God in NATURE IS ONE, but IN PERSON GOD IS THREE.

"The Angelus" April 1987

1. Thursday - June 18, 1987 is the Feast of Corpus Christi (THE BODY OF CHRIST). This is the solemn commemoration of the Holy Eucharist which was instituted at the Last Supper on Holy Thursday.
2. The Mass of the Most Blessed Sacrament will be said at St. Francis on Thursday morning at 7:30 A.M. All who can, should try to attend this mass.
3. The Blessed Sacrament is reserved in St. Francis Chapel in Cullman. Therefore, when either entering the chapel or leaving the chapel, everyone should GENUFLECT out of reverence to the Blessed Sacrament. In recent years, so it seems, the practice of genuflecting has gone into disuse. This is part of the Catholic inheritance we must strive to RESTORE.
