There is now a general agreement that people of ALL creeds and beliefs should JOIN together in prayer: prayer for peace, prayer for success, prayer for safety, prayer for prosperity -- PRAYER ALWAYS FOR SOME TEMPORAL BENEFIT. People of such inclinations disagree in the most essential conceptions of the NATURE OF GOD to Whom they are supposed to be praying, and yet they believe they are achieving something great because they ALL express the same sentiments. Sadly enough, these sentiments were to be witnessed recently at the "great" meeting of world religions in Assisi. The desire for prayer is good, but this eclecticism makes of prayer a merely selfish desire. In these reunions for prayer (prayer meetings) may be seen the spirit of materialism and mechanicism, that is characteristic of this age. Such exhibitions are reversals of the true order of things and are impossible for anyone with an UNDERSTANDING OF WHAT PRAYER IS. We must KNOW to Whom we are praying, and the more we KNOW about Him the more intimate and enduring become our prayers. Prayer is the LIFTING UP OF ONE'S MIND AND HEART TO GOD.

1. Thursday, August 20, 1987 is the feastday of the great St. Bernard. He did much good for the Church in earlier times of trouble. Let us pray to him and ask help from him in these our troubled times.
2. Please pray most earnestly that Pope John Paul II will soon grant us the LEGAL RIGHT to have the Latin Tridentine RITE. Even though the Latin Tridentine Rite is the official Rite of the Roman Church, in our troubled times we are forced to ask for the legal right to have and to hold the Trindentine Mass (which is already ours). The Tridentine Mass is ours by legal right simply because we are Baptized Members of the Apostolic Roman Church.
3. Confessions are heard before every mass on Sunday.
4. In order to exist, each chapel has the heavy burden of COST AND EXPENSE. Therefore each member is kindly asked to help in this area, and maintain proper contributions that will help meet daily costs. Everyone is asked to SACRIFICE JUST A LITTLE for the work that God has placed on our shoulders. The situation is grave, and the perpetuation of the Holy Sacrifice of the mass depends on the effort that everyone puts forth.
