To still its craving, the soul flings itself into the pursuit of everything that holds promise of pleasure and gratification: expensive trips, costly and rare gifts, palatial houses, fine clothes, gourmet foods, exotic perfumes, erotic experiences, etc. etc. The soul actually seeks happiness in such things - - - pleasure, yes - - happiness, no. Vain endeavour! Man, rejecting God as his happiness and obstinately resolved to find his happiness elsewhere, plunges from depth to depth into an abyss of moral nothingness and misery.

1. Friday, July 22, 1988 is the Feast of St. Mary Magdalen.
2. When anyone tells you that you are "EXCOMMUNICATED" do not be intimidated, embarrassed, fearful, apologetic, or defensive. Only the uninformed and bigoted and prejudiced will say such a thing to you. You are not excommunicated, and you cannot be excommunicated (by anyone) because you have not done wrong. It is your RIGHT to attend the mass of your choice. You DO NOT COMMIT SIN WHEN YOU ATTEND A LATIN TRIDENTINE MASS!
3. The evil wrought by sin can be overcome, at least in part, by voluntary penance and sacrifice. ALL are bound to penance and sacrifice. Monasteries and convents have a particular obligation to do such, and Christ the King Priory is one such place where this form of prayer is offered to God by the Monks. Among other types of mortification, the Monks deny themselves the use of meat, and their meals are meatless, except possibly on such feasts as Christmas and Easter and some very few other occasions. This is done, not only in satisfaction for the monks' personal needs, but in satisfaction for the needs of others, so that IN ALL THINGS GOD MAY BE GLORIFIED.
