Original sin let loose three powerful unholy principles in us. They are: (1) THE CONCUSPICENCE OF THE FLESH, (2) THE CONCUSPICENCE OF THE EYES, and (3) THE PRIDE OF LIFE. By the Concupiscence of the Flesh man is moved to gratify his cravings for happiness through every form of sense-satisfaction. Like the Prodigal, man is doomed to find that he is feeding on the "husks of swine"! The Concupiscence of the Eyes prompts him to seek greatness and distinction and the excellent life in the amassing of wealth and the power that wealth commands. In the end, such a man will eventually be shattered by the words: "Thou fool, this night do I require thy soul of thee, and whose shall those things be which thou hast provided?" By the Pride of Life man aims at putting himself at the centre of the universe. He removes God from His rightful place, and considers himself the rightful maker of all things. Everything becomes "man centered". Is this what God had in mind when He made man? Is our "mainstream church" fighting these principles with sufficient effort and GOOD EXAMPLE?
