To forgive all injuries To pray for the living and the dead. 7. SPIRITUAL WORKS OF MERCY - - Acts of love toward our neighbor to help him in the needs of his soul. And since the soul is far more important than the body, the spiritual works of mercy are far more important than the corporal works of mercy.
