A man has Charity, that is, he has true and sincere love for God, when he pursues the INTERESTS of God with the same eagerness and intensity as the self lover (the self-centered individual) pursues his own. One cannot love God with any intensity without being driven by that love to make God's purposes on earth his own - - God's purposes to be realized on earth. God is Charity. His purpose is to achieve the welfare, the peace and the happiness of mankind. God is the doer of good to His creatures (we must be certain that we fully UNDERSTAND the meaning of GOOD according to God's definition). God is ever working at the purpose of good. God is actively beneficent. Therefore, it is impossible to become intimate with God - - intimacy is the fruit of all real prayer - - without catching the Spirit of God. We reach God through prayer. But prayer is not to be viewed as a duty which one must fulfill in order to place the God of power and might under obligation. Prayer that is inspired by such a feeling cannot be rightly classified as quality prayer. Prayer must be free and should spring forth from the spirit of one's love. Prayer is simply the lifting up of one's mind and heart to his Beloved - namely God - the God of Charity. Prayer should be constant and stable, and its worth is not to be determined by the level of devotion one experiences at the moment of prayer. Such prayer would be emotionalism - - the plague of modern day "worshippers".
