FEAST OF CHRIST THE KING

October 30, 1988 - - White

During the time of the public life of Our Lord, the masses of the people were generally interested only in wonders and in security. When Christ multiplied the loaves and fishes, He startled their eyes. When He cured the sick, they marveled at Him. When He filled their stomachs, He satisfied their sense of social justice. That was the kind of king they wanted, a bread king. "What else can religion do for man, anyway, except give him his social security?" they seemed to ask. The people tried to force Him to become a king. That is what Satan wanted, too! Fill stomachs, turn stones into bread, promise prosperity, provide good health - this is the end of living to most mortals. But Our Lord would have no kingship based on the economics of plenty. To make Him King was His Father's business, not theirs; His Kingship would be of hearts and souls, not of stomachs and good health. Therefore He fled into the mountains Himself, alone, to escape their cheap crown. How close the people were to salvation! They wanted life (here and now); He wanted to give "LIFE". The difference was in their interpretation of life. Is it the business of Christ the King to win followers by elaborate social programs? This is one form of life. Or is it the business of Christ to be willing to lose all the stomach-minded people at the cost of reaching the FEW who have FAITH, to whom will be given THE BREAD OF LIFE????
