SUNDAY, November 27th. is THE FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT. Therefore we should begin to get ready for this great Church Season. The entire Christmas Season begins with a period of PREPARATION called ADVENT, a word that means coming - the coming of the PROMISED REDEEMER. This first part of the new Liturgical Year emphasizes Advent because it is especially devoted to a study of those centuries during which God was preparing the world for the coming of His Son. Advent, besides reminding us of Christ's first coming at Bethlehem, prepares us for His coming by grace at Christmas and His final coming at the end of the world. The spirit of Advent is one of preparation and of PENITENTIAL EXPECTATION and joy. In her liturgy the Church keeps repeating: HE IS COMING!!! Advent represents those dark centuries following the Fall of Man, when the human race waited longingly for the Great Deliverer. This penitential spirit is preached by Isaias the PROPHET and St. John the Baptist. The spirit is manifested by the use of Mass Vestments of a violet color.
