The conduct and bearing of Mary and Joseph in their fruitless quest for shelter in the hour of their very great need, give us a great lesson as to how we should bear ourselves in the great disappointments of our lives and under the rebuffs and scorn of fortune. If we analyse our thoughts with regard to these events we shall find that we probably look upon the whole scene as a CAREFULLY arranged stage-play: as something planned by God and prepared for our edification and instruction. It might have appeared to us that Joseph was instructed to go from door to door and the inn-keeper was instructed to refuse, but all was to happen in accordance with a PREVIOUS understanding. We should be careful in studying our Lord's life to dismiss this thought from our minds. It is true that all was foreseen by God - but it is equally true to say that nothing was prearranged in the stage sense. All things fell out just as freely and naturally as if God foresaw nothing. Joseph's asking was earnest and sincere. Each rebuff cut him to the heart. He never lost his tranquillity. He was most anxious, but his request never degenerated into an unmanly importunity. He asked with humility, and he accepted his refusal with dignity. For, in all his disappointments Joseph saw God's Will and he instantly conformed himself to it, knowing that in all things GOD KNOWS BEST.
