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The way to capture the nontraditional mind or the unbelieving mind is not by overpowering arguments that shatter all objections, nor by devastating logic that demolishes the citadels of error! Neither will spectacular debates, where opponent thunders at opponent with computer-powered scholarship, be of any benefit to one whose faith receives no nourishment from such sterile exercises.

A simple and charitable exposition of truth and a humble presentation of it will help one become a saint — and, more than likely, lead the uncertain mind to higher levels of holiness. Then will the unbelieving mind be gradually led to ask questions about man's purpose here on earth.
