In the Easter issue of the SPECULUM, the article entitled "Preface to the Ordo" was misinterpreted by some of our readers. There are those who took the article to mean that Christ the King Abbey has gone (or is going) to a vernacular liturgy - to a vernacular Mass. Nothing is father from the truth. The article was meant to be a WARNING SIGNAL to the lovers of Latin. In many places today, Latin is being inserted into the Novus Ordo Mass, to the delight of those who love the sounds of Latin. In quite a number of places, the LATIN NOVUS ORDO MASS IS <u>**REPLACING</u>** THE LATIN TRIDENTINE MASS –</u> and the people do not know the difference, since many see no difference between one or other rite as long as it is in Latin! The term "LATIN MASS" is extremely deceptive. That term, today, can be taken to mean either the Novus Ordo Mass or the Tridentine Mass. Henceforth, it would be very wise to insist on the exclusive use of the term "TRIDENTINE" when speaking of the Mass of the Council of Trent. The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass is the fundamental issue - NOT LATIN! A word to the WISE: check out "Protocol Number 1411" issued by the Sacred Congregation of Rites on July 3, 1999. Ignore the verbiage! Look only at the bottom line!
