## ?? Formation or Training ??

In today's disheveled catholic religious environment, the largest majority of **CATHOLIC PEOPLE** have forgotten how to act as Catholics! Proper Catholic decorum – Catholic reverence for the sacred – is a thing of the past! This sadness is found also among priests, monks, and nuns. The younger have never known true Catholic Experience. Not only is this true with the New Order Catholics – in large measure it is also true among Traditional Catholics. Every effort must be made to bring back holiness into **CATHOLICITY!** 

Long, long ago, young men and women – in seminaries; in monasteries; in convents – were placed under the kindly, the dedicated, the consecrated, the <u>firm</u> guidance of older experienced men and women who had been tried and purified in their own vocations. In those golden days, candidates were **FORMED** and not **TRAINED!** The difference between formation and training is enormous. The excellent example and inspiration given by our forefathers in religion produced the great leaders of our once Holy, Catholic, Apostolic and One Catholic Church of happier and more stable days. Usually the young candidates were taught and formed in their own institutes. <u>INBREEDING?</u> NO! INDEED! No – because trustworthy, good and holy bishops and religious superiors were quite conscientious in fulfilling their duties of good supervision and administration.

As the MODERN age began to make its appearance, and sophisticated learning techniques became the order of the day, religious superiors gradually began to give in to the call and renown of large universities. Candidates were sent away to such places – unsupervised – and were allowed, even, to go to the schools of their own choosing. They traveled to schools where they could be **TRAINED** in the skills they themselves considered useful to their "religious career" or their "ministerial profession". The advice of their superiors was spurned and the importance of ascetical formation was completely disregarded. Asceticism became a mental sickness which needed psychiatric attention!

Men and women who have been called by God to serve Him in Holy Religion are not **TRAINED** – **THEY ARE FORMED** – they are formed in the holiness of life called for by their high calling. a transformation in the soul who has answered the call of God!

THE SCHOLARLY priests – and bishops – have proceeded in recent years to launch a never ending program of "**RENEWAL**". Most of those who did not willingly conform to the new program were sent (by force at times) to psychiatrists or were condemned to a life of bitter embarrassment and an isolated martyrdom!
