We had no chipmunks but the Abbot was able to have a friend trap just TWO chipmunks, which he happily and carefully released around the Abbey. - The Sisters are always busy doing what Sisters do. We are very grateful for the prayers and for all the Altar work they perform in keeping the Abbey Church in good order. Sacristy work never ends. The Sisters,too, have been busy in the various works of summer.
