Jesus said to her; "I WHO SPEAK WITH THEE AM HE!"

Such astonishing words had never been heard by any public figure before that moment. She was stunned! Even though many times in His public life Christ had demonstrated powers that were far beyond human powers, He had never proclaimed exactly Who He really was. No one knew, not even Satan, who was very much interested in the identity of Christ. This revelation was made to a poor sinful and nameless Samaritan woman, all because she gave Him a drink of water?
